The issue directly affects regional stability in the Middle East, global security, and the credibility of agreements such as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action. Recent escalations, including the 2025 conflict and renewed enrichment activities, make this topic highly relevant and urgent today. Delegates must consider how to balance sovereignty, security, sanctions, inspections, and diplomatic engagement while preventing further nuclear proliferation and armed conflict.

I believe that as delegates of this topic, you should address the balance between Iran's sovereign right to peaceful nuclear energy under the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons and the international community's responsibility to prevent nuclear proliferation. Many blocs may focus on the effectiveness of the International Atomic Energy Agency inspections, the future of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, and whether sanctions, diplomacy, or security guarantees are the most viable path forward. You delegates should consider how to extend breakout time, reduce regional escalation, and create enforceable yet realistic mechanisms that address both security concerns and political realities.
